

Fourth Plain Focus Area





- Began in 2015
- Originally focused on small businesses
- Expanded to include support to residents



50% POC (30% in Vancouver)

21% residents born outside US (14% in Vancouver)

34% residents speak a language other than English at home (20% in Vancouver)





17% families live below poverty line (8% in Vancouver)

69% renters (48% in Vancouver)

17% residents with bachelor's degree or higher (30% in Vancouver)

- Reduce racial and economic disparities related to housing, income, and quality of life
- Utilize prescriptive policies that address needs identified through community engagement efforts



Community Engagement Survey Results

- Rising rents are a reality
- Renters have less financial resilience to withstand spikes in housing costs than homeowners
- Preferred solutions:
 - Rental payment assistance
 - Utility payment assistance
 - Stronger tenant protections







Evergreen Habitat Background

Affordable Homeownership

- Building homes in partnership with local families since 1991
- Homes are sold to families through 0% interest mortgages
- Mortgage payments do not exceed 30% of income
- Each Habitat homebuyer contributes 500 hours of "sweat equity"

Other Programs

- Home Repair: Minor exterior home repairs or large-scale structural & system repairs for low-income owners
- Neighborhood Revitalization: asset-based community development partnerships
- Clark County Habitat Store: home improvement store and donation center fundraising arm of Habitat



Evergreen Habitat Background

Local Impact

- Over 100 families served through homeownership and home repairs
- 1000 volunteers contribute 15,000 hours annually



Home Repair

- Keeping families and seniors in their homes (Aging In Place)
 - Installing handrails and grab bars, wheelchair ramps, ADA accessibility, roofs, etc.
- Families and individuals who make between 20-80% AMI
