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### Steve Butler's Take-Aways

- Put yourself "in the other person's shoes" to better understand their viewpoints
- Always keep the broad Public Interest in mind!
- Important to be internally motivated
- Be respectful of everyone, regardless of their position or "rank"
- Long-range planning is important, but implementation is even more so!

### Adrian Smith's Take-Aways

- Get to know people.
- Recognize what you love about where you live and work.
- Connect your daily tasks to your community's long-term goals.

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### Jacob Gonzalez's Take-Aways

- Be Authentic Be Yourself
- Keep Learning Surround Yourself with Challenges
- Be Patient! Trust the work.

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### McCaela Daffern's Take-Aways

- The path to finding your calling is not a straight line
- Try everything
- You will never achieve anything great on your own
- Build credibility and relationships
- Supervision is hard
- Be intentional about learning to lead

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#### Donna deBit's Take-Aways

- Remind yourself of your 'why'. You picked this profession after all!
- Explore the profession. Planning covers so much!
- Burnout is a real thing. Try not to get to that point!
