Tips for engaging with the public about planning

- 1. Discuss real issues about specific places people care about in their community.
- 2. Let participants come to their own conclusions
- 3. Incorporate a hands on activity.
- 4. Inquire versus inform \rightarrow *tell me more...*
- 5. Build & maintain relationships over time.
- 6. Offer prizes / swag. Make winning them fun.
- 7. Go out into the community to places where people feel comfortable.
